FOUNDATIONS OF CARE

Keynote: with Kym Macfarlane

Kym will inspire early childhood educators to really listen and to become engaged in children's conversations. Kym will look at ways children interact and provide strategies for staff to improve their listening skills and to become involved with children. While looking at strategies to embed listening into the curriculum in ways that acknowledge the competent learner and the skilful communicator.

Children—Our Future with Michael Pecic

This session provides childcare workers and educators with an insight into child protection. This seminar explores tools and activities designed to minimise the risks of child abuse, enhance the child's use of their safety networks and develop ongoing communication skills.

Duty of Care with Susan Cislowski

To gain an understanding of the meaning of "Duty of Care" within the context of the Child Care Act and Regulations, Workplace Health and Safety and Common Law and its impact on policy development implementation within the Child Care Industry.

Social Misery or Social Mastery? with Dr Margie Carter

Participants will consider the set up of their play spaces from a social misery/social mastery point of view. They will reflect on their role as the adult in setting children up for social success and social failure. Participants will identify what helps and what hinders children's social development. Participants will be introduced to a new way of viewing children's behaviour. They will be invited to use their new knowledge to design social environments where children and adults thrive rather than just survive.

Inclusive Practices with Maria Clayton

Understanding is the key to inclusion, understanding ourselves, the environment and the families and children who access them. This workshop will explore Belonging, Being and Becoming and what that looks like for children from Culturally and Linguistically diverse backgrounds, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children with additional needs. As a group we will explore Reflective practices and the physical environment along with building relationships with families to support inclusion.

Dr Kym MacFarlane is a Senior Lecturer in the School of Human Services and Social Work at the Logan Campus of Griffith University. Kym's research expertise includes working with children in Early Childhood settings, reconceptualising Early Childhood Education, designing innovative programs for students involved in flexible learning and post-structuralist research.

Michael Pecic has 19 years' police experience in complex child protection investigations and public safety. He provides not only 'hands on' experience, but a wealth of formal training including a Diploma in Public Administration and Management, Associate Diploma of Public Safety and Certificate IV in Training.

Susan Cislowski joined ACSEA in October 2001 and currently assists members with their phone enquiries from a simple pay rate to advice on recruitment and selection and disciplinary and counselling procedures as well as delivering yearly seminars. During the last ten years Susan has also been a member of the State Executive of the Queensland Council of Parents and Citizens Association, Board Member of the Queensland Schools Curriculum Council and the Board of Teacher Registration. This Experience in the community sector gives Susan the ability to structure the advice offered based on her understanding of the structure and culture of volunteer committee's and in language that is relevant to their knowledge.

Dr Margaret-Anne Carter works in a range of positions in care and education settings across Australia. She is recognised in this field as an exemplary educator, creating teaching and learning environments inclusive of all. Margie regularly presents at conferences, facilitates professional learning sessions, and publishes in scholarly journals. She is the designer of high quality, up to date professional development resource and curriculum material in areas including child social emotional behaviour, children with complex needs, parenting and self care.

Maria Clayton is an inclusion facilitator with CAERSU and she has worked within the disability field for over 15 years. She has a Cert IV in training and assessing, Cert IV in teacher aid disabilities, a Cert III in children's services and a Diploma of Community Welfare and Counselling. Maria has extensive knowledge and skills in supporting children services and their staff to include children from all target groups. Maria is very passionate about the inclusion of families and their children and supporting the capacity building of staff.
